Back in March of 2002, a new RCT website emerged. Taking up the name of rct:2, the name was originally meant to mean rct(mark 2). because it was my second RCT site venture. To my surprise, and delight, Rollercoaster Tycoon 2 was announced just weeks after development finished.

During this time, I was a regular member at RCTUK. Boomer also posted there on a regular basis. I as approached by the screen name of 'Boomer' complete with avatar (from which he still tells me has some similarity to his real life graphic). What awaited me in the Private Message was priceless, little did I know I was about to give a chance to one of the best writers this community has seen. I'm pretty sure still to this day, that if I hadn't of given him the go, he will have still found his way to where he is today, due to pure perseverance.

Boomer asked me, begged me to let his talents fly into a website on a regular basis. At the time, we decided it would be a great addition to the site, as I couldn't think of any other website that had original writing talents available for the visitor to take 'another perspective' into the rct community. Overall, it was pretty weird how he took hold of the team at rct:2. At first he was a little cautious, as many people would be. He has no idea if his creations would rub off on visitors, or if his writing would turn off visitors. He strived to create and display, asking for comments and feedback whenever he could. This would not only help the talent, but encourage him! All he could hear was the cry of delight from the readers.

His first e-view came on April 24th 2002. Doctor J, creator of some of best utilities experienced the hot seat. This was a huge hit with the small fan base rct:2 had now gathered, which was rapidly increasing.

It took him only two further weeks to find Oblivion, followed by a friend of his, known as VooDew5, who was a popular character at the rct:2 forums. His real big break came, when he finally managed to grab the attentions of the 'top dog' webmaster, Red Phoenix. This e-view was what made people start to look, and realise the talent was there. The site became a temple for the writing, the forums where busy and big, clocking well over 3000 page views a day was no mean feat for site that was only 1 month old.

It wasn't long before Boomer started on various other people, each from a unique background. Good friend of mine Joshua Vanderburg (webmaster of RCTOA.com at the time) followed, then did Pops, major hit was Henry Winkelstein, Chocobogo and Tim Miller.

By now, rct:2 was a haven, one of the major rct websites on the net, bar the big three at the time (RCT Station, Tycoon Planet & RCTUK). RCTOA was our host, experiencing major problems with downtime and such. Boomer suffered as a result. This was a real problem for me personally. I didn't want to let anyone down, and after the problem persisted for a while, Boomer asked if he could leave rct:2 to take up a position here at RCT2.com. Of course, I was under no obligation at all to stop him, I agreed and we exchanged kind
